This school year is flying by! Soon we will be planning for graduation and leaving for summer break. With part of the year in review and looking to what is ahead, we see opportunity. We see the opportunities God has blessed us with and the wonderful opportunities we have to look forward to.

As a school community, we've created "Comet Time" for our middle and high school students to connect with each other, connect with staff and faculty, and connect more with the Lord.

On Mondays, middle and high school students participate in Spiritual, Social & Emotional Learning (SSEL) where students have the opportunity to develop things like goal setting, responsible decision making, and managing stress. Scripture and truth are interwoven into the mini lessons and topics. Our elementary students participate in SSEL as well, teaching them to think before they act, manage their emotions and how to

At all levels, students engage in chapel. Middle and high school students have chapel on Wednesdays. Elementary meets on Fridays. God provides great opportunity to share Truth through various speakers, pastors and experience chapels for students to grow their faith.

Additionally, J-Term is a two-week window of extra elective classes for high school students to explore, do and create. This year's extra electives included classes like pottery, drones, cooking/home economics and theater. We also have upper classes connecting with elementary classes, to make connection and be strong role models.

In fall 2025, we are partnering with Oxford Virtual to offer high school students' additional elective options not currently offered in house.
